Otherwise, you may wait to take the cumulative exam for modules 1-3. Whichever exam you choose to take, you must take it at the Study Center within two weeks of the third class session *or earlier*. **After two weeks, if we have not received your exam at the Study Center and you have not contacted us, you will fail the course.**
- If you fail the exam, you will be notified by mail. You may take a make-up exam at the Study Center within one week of receiving notification of the failed exam.
