We encourage your prayerful attention to this as a leadership team.

When complete, arrange a time to meet and review your conclusions with your consultant.

OVERVIEW

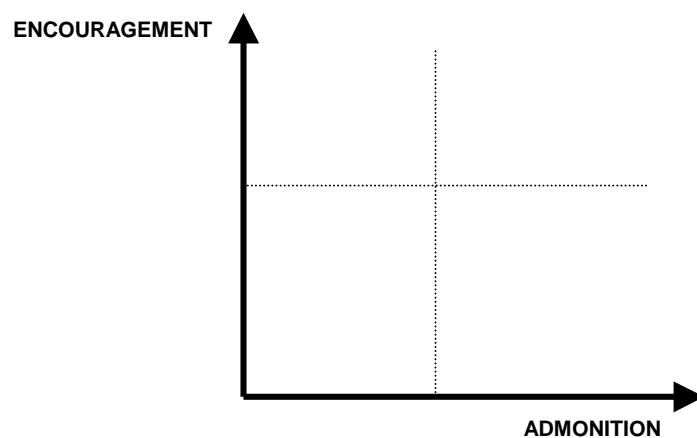
1. Find the Attendance % on the "Profile Report" (located at the top of 1st page). This shows you the % of growth – this year vs. last year. (Note: groups that have planted within the last 24 months share the % with their sister church). Is the church growing? How would you assess your progress?
2. Review the roster in the "Profile Report." Who are the new cell group members over the last 12 months?
3. Identify losses from your group. (Roster provides Inactive members). Why did these people leave?
4. Examine the "Group Evaluation" report. What does this suggest about member commitment to increasing biblical knowledge?

5. Examine “Group Evaluation” report. How has member involvement in external ministry affected your group?

6. Examine the FST portion of the “Group Evaluation” report. What does this suggest about member commitment to financial stewardship?

7. Does your prayer ministry suggest that the members understand that dependence on God is central to spiritual health? How have you led members toward prayer?

8. If needed, review the article, *Body-Life: Encouraging & Admonishing One Another*, http://www.xenos.org/classes/principles/cpu3_encourage.htm. Each leader should independently plot where they see the group at this time on the graph below.



EVANGELISTIC EFFORTS

1. Identify those members who brought people to HG/CT in the last year.
2. List those members who have led someone to Christ in the last year and the name of the person who was led to Christ.
3. Beside the members listed in the previous two questions, whom do you believe is gifted in evangelism?
4. Do the members of your group have an adequate number of relationships with non-Christians (Y/N)?
5. Who assists your evangelists/bringers with follow up? Who could be encouraged to help, that currently is not?
6. What outreach-oriented activities have you done this year (i.e. include any kind of event, large or small)? Which ones were successful? Why were they successful?
7. After reviewing your answers to the previous 6 questions – sketch out your plan for evangelism in the next year. (You may find it easier to do this on a separate piece of paper).

1. Who are your future leaders?

Do these potential leaders know you view them this way? Do they have a vision for leading their own group?

2. Identify your expected cell group plants. Who will lead each side of the plant? When is it feasible to do so?

3. How long will it take for your future leaders to lead their own group? Why this timing?

4. Rate the following factors that might hinder your plant from 1 (i.e. this factor has no hindrance on our planting) to 5 (i.e. this factor has the greatest hindrance on our planting).
