Xenos Christian Fellowship has a campus at 1934 N. Fourth Street at the corner of 4th and 18th. The church has invested over \$6.5 million on the once-distressed property since acquiring it in 2005.

- The buildings on site house a Mid-Ohio Food Bank pantry and social services location. We partner with Mid-Ohio Food Bank to subsidize rent for the spaces that they need and we provide a large group of active volunteers for the pantry.
- Xenos operates multiple free resources for area residents working out of the 4th St. location. Expert and other volunteers donate hundreds of hours every year providing:
 - A free medical clinic for low-income community members, with optometry services and physical therapy.
 - A free dental clinic, staffed in conjunction with the Vineyard Columbus church.
 - Note that we also host a free legal clinic on the East Side of Columbus.
- International Friendships Inc. (a registered Ohio State University student organization) reports that, with more than 480 volunteers, Xenos is their largest source of volunteer help in settling and transitioning foreign students into OSU housing. Our volunteers also provide ongoing mentoring for many of those students throughout their stay in Columbus.
- Xenos ministry houses support hundreds of struggling students in pursuit of college degrees and/or successful training in a trade. These houses provide strong community, life coaching, tutoring and a commitment to learning.
