

Xenos Christian Fellowship Community Involvement

CHURCH Overview

Xenos Christian Fellowship is a local church, currently serving the spiritual needs of about 6,000 Columbus residents.

- Hundreds of people have recovered from addiction and alcoholism through Xenos. The church emphasizes reaching out to troubled people and actively serving in small, supportive communities, including home churches and what's sometimes called 'ministry houses'. These are groups of people who meet regularly to study the Bible, organize service projects and help one another in navigating life's problems and opportunities.
- Hundreds more people have been restored from abusive or dysfunctional upbringing and gone on to have well-adjusted lives and families. Xenos members' support and counseling services are critical to these recovery efforts.
- Hundreds of Xenos members regularly volunteer for dozens of local community service providers including: food pantries, clothing providers, homeless outreach, free clinics, public schools, hospice care, and various recovery groups.
- In cooperation with City Life Ministry on Columbus' West side, Xenos volunteers mentor inner city students and help train them in auto mechanics and a variety of other life skills. Additional student-focused ministries in South Linden, around the Ohio State University District and in other Central Ohio areas focus on living productive lives and serving alongside students and their families.
- Xenos is very active in serving the refugee population in Columbus, including helping refugees find and furnish housing and adjust to their new environment. Xenos has a facility on the north side dedicated to taking in and distributing household materials to newly arrived families in Columbus. Over 100 refugee families have had their household needs met through the work of Xenos since 2007, while dozens more have received additional assistance and support from our community volunteers.
- Xenos facilities across Central Ohio are a flexible and inexpensive resource for many community groups. We host monthly and annual meetings for multiple Columbus City Schools organizations, Franklin County board groups, voting precincts and area colleges, along with other non-profit organizations.
